| Key Vocabulary | Definition |
|-------------------------|--|
| <u>Caring</u> | Displaying kindness and concern for others |
| <u>Jesus</u> | A religious leader and founder of Christianity. The Son of God |
| <u>Christian</u> | Christians are people who believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, and who follow his teachings |
| <u>Bible</u> | The Christian Special Book. The Bible is split into two sections – the Old Testament and the New Testament. The New Testament tells stories about Jesus. |
| <u>Jews</u> | People who follow the religion of Judaism and believe that there is only one God, who created the world and everything in it. |
| <u>Sukkot</u> | Many people believe the festival of Sukkot is a time to remember those who are poor by giving meals and shelter and donating money (tzedakah) |
| <u>Tzedakah</u> | Tzedakah is the Jewish idea of giving to those who need help. For Jewish people this is part of making the world a better place. |
| <u>Torah</u> | The Jewish Holy Book |

Possible Experiences (things I could do at home to help)

- + Talk about acts of kindness and what the children could do to show they care.



- + To help the children understand what it is like to give something away they could try this activity:
- + Ask your child to make a 'gift' from resources that you have at home. When they have made a gift, ask them to give it to their neighbour, a friend or a family member.
- + Ask them to talk about what it feels like to give something away. Is it a difficult thing to do?
