### Key Knowledge

- **What I am going to learn...**
- Muslims are committed to being part of the global Ummah. They stick together, they are one under Allah.
- Christians are committed to believing in God's grace, or generosity. They think God forgives everyone who truly repents.
- Hindus are committed to Ahimsa. They try to live life without killing or harming anything that lives.
- Prophet Muhammad (pbuh) as the last messenger of God for Muslims.
- Other messengers from other religions include Adam, Abraham and Jesus.
- The 4 ways of sharing within the Ummah: Zakat and Qurbani, Charity across the world, The Hajj,
- Stories of the Prophet and the words of the Qur'an.
- Gandhi had non-violent principles. He was a Hindu who believed in and was committed to the principle of ahimsa, meaning harmlessness or non-violence.
- When God sees us do something wrong, he doesn't stop us. But if we ask, he does forgive us. For Christians, this is what 'Grace' means, and it's a very important part of what they believe about God.

<b>Ummah</b>	The worldwide community of Muslims
<b>Zakat</b>	The pillar of charitable giving and wealth and poverty
<b>Ahimsa</b>	Harmlessness
<b>Qurbani</b>	Sacrifice
<b>Haji</b>	The greater Muslim pilgrimage to Mecca, which takes place in the last month of the year and which all Muslims are expected to make at least once in their lifetime if they can afford to do so. One of the Five Pillars Of Islam.
<b>Prophet</b>	A person regarded as an inspired teacher or proclaimer of the will of God
<b>Sewa</b>	Selfless service
