<b>What is a password and why should we keep them safe?</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A password is a secret word or phrase that allows a user to access a website.</li> <li>Passwords are like toothbrushes in that they should not be shared with anyone else.</li> </ul>
<b>Is everything I read on the Internet true?</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Just because something is on the Internet doesn't mean that it is true.</li> <li>Some people create spoof websites that pretend to be something else such a bank website or to provide misleading information.</li> </ul>
<b>How do I know if I am old enough to play a computer game?</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Computer games, like films, are often not suitable for children.</li> <li>PEGI ratings will show how old a person must be to play a game.</li> </ul>
