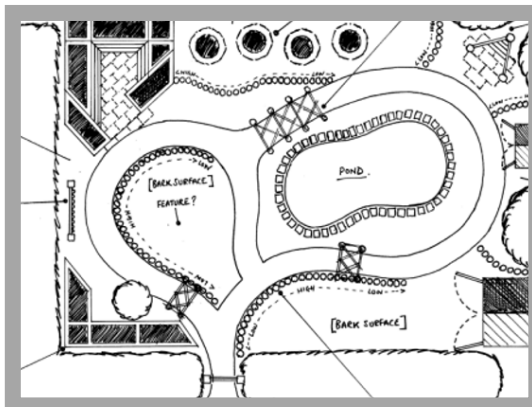


We held Christmas and Summer fairs where we made products to sell to raise money. We raised £759.34 at the Christmas fayre and £1064.17 at the summer fayre.
